<b>Targeted Academic Support</b>	<p><b>Year 14 Preparation for Adulthood – Leavers</b></p> <p>1 x Job Coach – Summer Term 2021. Approximately £10,000 (FTE £35k)</p> <p>Year 14 pupils have significantly less time to catch up on lost learning than any other year group in the school. They are a priority group for us to ensure they are best prepared for the next stage of their education.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students have opportunities to visit colleges or supported internships with support.</li> <li>• Students have professional help and support with applications and interviews for college or jobs with training.</li> <li>• Job coach assists with travel training in preparation for independence at college or work</li> <li>• Increased, supported opportunities for job tasters.</li> </ul>			<b>£10,000</b>
